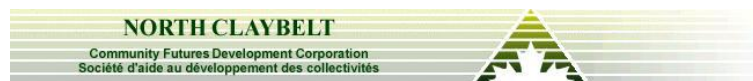
The Olympic Experience – A Volunteer’s Journey



Born in Kapuskasing but raised in Sudbury, Randy Pascal has been involved in local sports since early teens, although not usually as an athlete. Over his high school and post secondary years, he would volunteer with countless local sports, organizations, obtaining his Bachelor of Commerce in Sports Administration degree from Laurentian University.

The presentation is essentially a look back not only at Randy’s experience that he enjoyed as a volunteer at the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, but also the road as a volunteer that would lead him to this point. The discussion will highlight the invaluable contribution that volunteers make within the world of amateur sports, and also the rewards that can be gleaned from volunteerism.

### 5) **Community Sport in Action**

Presenter: Kasey Liboiron, True Sport Community Animator

Released in 2008, the True Sport Report provides clear evidence that good sport can make a great difference – what can you do to ensure that sport lives up to its potential in your community? This workshop will profile communities in action and describe how they have integrated new approaches and adapted their program delivery to get the most out of their community sport and recreation initiatives.
